




Major Bias

College students think male-dominated fields are biased against women one survey of students found that the more male-dominated a field is, the more biased it is considered.1

*What is a Microaggression?

Merriam-Webster defines a microaggression as a comment or action that subtly (and often unconsciously or unintentionally) expresses a prejudiced attitude toward a member of a marginalized group, such as a racial minority.3




but confidence in meeting salary expectations is also a problem.4 Women are less confident than men
